WHO: Up to FIVE musicians per session who play the following instruments:

violin, viola, cello, bass, clarinet, flute, trumpet, trombone, french horn

Arts leaders work as a team to coach a student chamber ensemble through an intensive residency, culminating in a student showcase. Under the guidance of Conservatory Lab faculty and From the Top staff, the arts leaders: choose repertoire, plan and instruct daily coaching sessions, and develop all necessary and relevant materials. Arts leaders also form their own chamber ensemble, receive coaching from CLCS staff, and perform on the final day of the residency.

musiConnects strives to model and teach self-expression, peer leadership, and community development through the transformative power of chamber music. They provide intensive mentoring and community building through violin, viola, and cello lessons taught within a chamber music model.

WHO: Up to **FIVE** classically trained string players (violin, viola, cello) per session.

With support from musiConnects and From the Top staff, arts leaders instruct and coach individual students in musiConnects after-school programming. Arts leaders observe individual and chamber lessons as well as help to prepare lesson plans and participate in chamber group instruction with the students. The residency culminates with arts leaders teaching individual and chamber lessons of their own.
